Part 1

DANIEL'S 70 WEEKS PROPHECY IS SOON TO BE FULFILLED!

Things were not supposed to be this way. Imagine your nation was chosen by God to be exceptional and a "beacon of light" to all other nations but *suddenly* it was reduced to third-world, poverty status. In fact, your whole nation has been ransacked, defeated and taken over by the Babylonian Empire.

The once great God-fearing nation is reduced to servitude to a Gentile, idol-worshipping power. The year was about 539 BC. The nation was Judah. The prophet, trying to make sense of it all, was Daniel.

Daniel sought answers from the God he served, after coming upon some welcome news in an earlier prophecy by the prophet Jeremiah, who said that the Babylonian captivity would be for a period of 70 years.

For thus saith the LORD, That after seventy years be accomplished at Babylon I will visit you, and perform my good word toward you, in causing you to return to this place (Jer 29:10 KJV).

Great! Judah's captivity was coming to a close. 70 years was coming to an end. But, what next Lord?

Daniel decided to seek the Lord in prayer about Judah's future: but his prayer was interrupted by the archangel Gabriel.

What we're going to explain today is an important prophecy given to Daniel that not only proves the Messiahship of Jesus Christ but also spans millennia to reach into our pulsating present day with its ultimate prophetic fulfillment. For God's answer is as relevant to the 21st century world as it was to Judah in the sixth century BC, in fact *it's even more so*.

Gabriel's interruption, which we will explain, is contained in four distinct scriptures, the first of which is:

Seventy weeks are decreed as to your people and as to your holy city, to finish the transgression and to make an end of sins, and to

make atonement for iniquity, and to bring in everlasting righteousness, and to seal up the vision and prophecy, and to anoint the Most Holy (Dan 9:24 MKJV).

Daniel was contemplating the end of 70 years captivity, but now Gabriel enlarges that 70. God uses a day-for-a-year principle in prophecy (Ezekiel 4:6). So what God is saying is that there will be another 70 x 7 year prophecy, which equals 490 years.



The book of Daniel is one of the most important prophetic books of the Bible. It chronicles several prophecies that span thousands of years, many of which have been fulfilled. But there are several prophecies that have been preserved for our day. God told Daniel that his book would be "closed up" until the time of the end — it would be "opened up" when it was most needed (Daniel 12:4). That's today.

These prophetic 490 years are determined upon God's people and upon Jerusalem, with the ultimate goal to:

- finish the nation's transgression
- · make an end of sin
- make an atonement for iniquity
- bring in everlasting righteousness
- fulfill the vision and prophecy
- anoint the Most Holy Place, which is the Holy of Holies in the Temple of God.

Notice the emphasis on sin and God graciously offering an atonement. It was for sin and rebellion from God that Judah found itself in captivity. They had not learned of sin's consequences from Israel, their sister nation to the north. For the sin of idolatry, Israel in the 8th century B.C. was conquered, ejected from their land and disappeared into the world — where they remain as lost tribes to this day.

The atonement for sin is certainly an allusion to the Messiah, who would also *anoint* the Most Holy Place by His very presence in the Temple, which would only take place in the prophesied reign of the Messiah upon His return.

But when does this span of time start? And where are we now in its fulfillment? And what does this have to do with today?

TIMING OF THE MESSIAH'S APPEARANCE

Know therefore and understand, that from the going out of the command to restore and to build Jerusalem, to Messiah the Prince, shall be seven weeks, and sixty-two weeks. The street shall be built again, and the wall, even in times of affliction (Dan 9:25 MKJV).

Here's the answer. Gabriel says that the prophetic time begins when the *decree is issued to rebuild Jerusalem* and it ends when *the Messiah appears*. The time frame is going to be a total of 69 weeks, specifically 7 times 69, or a total of 483 years (based on Jewish and Babylonian calendars of a 360-day year that makes it 173,880 days).

So Jerusalem, though it was ransacked by the Babylonians and left in ruins, is going to be rebuilt!

Daniel was no way near Jerusalem! He was taken captive out of Judah and was now, due to God's favor, in the royal court within the Babylonian government. So how would this occur and when?

We know it didn't happen in Daniel's lifetime. In fact, Daniel was 82 years old when the control of Jerusalem would be wrested from the Babylonian Empire by the overpowering Persian Empire in 621 B.C.

But it was during the Persian control of Jerusalem that God would raise up a man named Nehemiah, who conveniently enough was cup-bearer to King Artaxerxes. The cup-bearer would guard against poison in the king's cup and was sometimes required to swallow the wine before serving it! This type of confidential relationship gave the cup-bearer great influence with

the king. In Nehemiah 2:1-8, we read about the decree to rebuild Jerusalem:

And it came to pass in the month Nisan, in the twentieth year of Artaxerxes the king, when wine was before him, that I took up the wine, and gave it unto the king. Now I had not been beforetime sad in his presence. And the king said unto me, Why is thy countenance sad, seeing thou art not sick? this is nothing else but sorrow of heart. Then I was very sore afraid. And I said unto the king, Let the king live for ever: why should not my countenance be sad, when the city, the place of my fathers' sepulchres, lieth waste, and the gates thereof are consumed with fire? Then the king said unto me, For what dost thou make request? So I prayed to the God of heaven. And I said unto the king, If it please the king, and if thy servant have found favour in thy sight, that thou wouldest send me unto Judah, unto the city of my fathers' sepulchres, that I may build it. And the king said unto me, (the queen also sitting by him,) For how long shall thy journey be? and when wilt thou return? So it pleased the king to send me; and I set him a time. Moreover I said unto the king, If it please the king, let letters be given me to the governors beyond the river, that they may let me pass through till I come unto Judah; and a letter unto Asaph the keeper of the king's forest, that he may give me timber to make beams for the gates of the castle which appertaineth to the house, and for the wall of the city, and for the house that I shall enter into. And the king granted me, according to the good hand of my God upon me (Nehemiah 2:1-8 RV).

Here we have the beginning date when the decree was issued. It was in the month of Nisan in the 20th year of Artaxerxes' reign. When the day of the month is not given in Jewish chronologies, then it can be assumed that the first day is meant. Thus, the 1st of Nisan, in the 20th year of King Artaxerxes of Babylon corresponds to March 14, 445 BC (according to Khouse.org).

Let's add 483 years to 445 B.C. and — *voila!* — converted to the Western calendar and corrected for leap years, we arrive at April 6, 32 A.D.!

THE TRIUMPHANT ENTRY

You tell me. Which Messianic figure was in the world at that time?

From the issuance of the decree to rebuild Jerusalem until the Messiah would be 483 years! That brings us right to the triumphant entry of Jesus Christ to Jerusalem just before His crucifixion for the world's sins!



This was the only time that Jesus Christ would allow Himself to be praised as King. The occasion was His triumphant entry to Jerusalem before He was crucified in the Spring of 32 A.D., fulfilling Daniel's 70 weeks prophecy about the Messiah's appearance.

Incidentally, Daniel's phrase "Messiah the Prince" in the King James translation is actually the Hebrew phrase, *Meshiach Nagid*, meaning "The Messiah the King."

This sure fulfillment of prophecy to prove the validity of God's word and the power of Almighty God in world affairs is an indictment against our educational system which has expelled both God and His word from students' curriculum!

THE MESSIAH WOULD BE CRUCIFIED

The prophecy of Jesus continues:

And after sixty-two weeks Messiah shall be cut off, but not for Himself. And the people of the ruler who shall come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary. And the end of it shall be with the flood, and ruins are determined, until the end shall be war (Dan 9:26 MKJV).

Notice the accuracy of God's word and the precision of its timing. Gabriel's word to Daniel not only pinpointed the timing of the Messiah's appearance, but *now* it also tells us that He would be crucified: *Messiah shall be cut off, but not for Himself.*

Of course, *not for Himself* means He died for the sins of the world. The Judeo-Christian theology of sin is *real*. The consequences of sin *is* evident all around us in this evil world we live in. But, the sacrifice for sins was paid in *full* by Jesus Christ.

It is never too late to turn to Him in humility and to ask Him to take away our sins so that we can have eternal life of joy and contentment with Him in the world to come. There is no other afterlife reality in heaven and hell except that which Jesus tells us is true.

Now the prophetic word continues: And the people of the ruler who shall come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary. Jerusalem would by this time be no longer ruled over by the Persians, but by Rome. And, sure enough, history shows that after the Crucifixion of Jesus Christ, Roman armies came into Jerusalem and sacked the city and destroyed the temple in 70 A.D.

Jesus warned his followers that destruction was coming to the temple (not one stone shall be upon another that shall not be cast down, Matthew 24:2) and to Jerusalem (O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, which killeth the prophets, and stoneth them that are sent unto her! how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and ye would not! Behold, your house is left unto you desolate, Matthew 23:37-38 RV).

And the end of it shall be with the flood, recalls the biblical idiom using the word flood to denote marauding armies overrunning the land (Isaiah 28:1-2).

And, finally, *ruins are determined, until the end shall be war.* For many centuries, Jerusalem had been left in ruins and war was always surrounding it.


But that's only 69 weeks? What happens to the "last week" of Daniel? When does that begin?

The last week outlined in "Daniel's 70 Weeks" jumps us prophetically to our pulsating 21st century. This prophecy given to Daniel by the archangel Gabriel tells us what will be the news headlines to come.

Part 2

DANIEL'S LAST WEEK PROPHECY: CLUES TO THE ANTICHRIST

Now we come to a very important prophetic word that is relevant to our day and time!



This next section of scripture is going to identify the Antichrist to come. There is much speculation and confusion about the Antichrist, so it's important to not be deceived by every *wind of doctrine* (Ephesians 4:14) that has come along. Jesus emphasized repeatedly that His people not be deceived about the Signs of the Times heralding His return (Matthew 24:45, 11, 23-26).

Daniel gives us *one more prophetic week* to be fulfilled *before* the return of Jesus! Using the day-for-a-year principle in prophecy (Ezekiel 4:6), we can determine that this "last week" is a total of *seven years*.

We are actually so close now to that prophetic week of *seven years* that we must conclude that the Antichrist is already alive on earth, waiting unseen in the wings for his debut performance.

Speaking of the Antichrist, Daniel's *last week* prophetic word says this:

And he shall confirm the covenant with many for one week: and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease, and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make it desolate, even until the consummation, and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate (Daniel 9:27 KJV).

Let's first understand what this is *not* saying!

- Nowhere does it say that the covenant is a peace treaty, as many contend:
- Nowhere does it say that the covenant is proposed as a seven year covenant, although God is telling us that it will ultimately last seven years (as fulfillment of Daniel's last week of the 70 weeks).

Here's what it *does* tell us. The Antichrist will *confirm the covenant* — but *what* covenant?

We must remember that the Jews of today, having rejected Jesus as their Messiah, are still looking for the One to fulfill the scriptures pertaining to Messiah. **Jeremiah 31:31** says, *Behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel, and with the house of Judah* (KJV). This incidentally is a reference to Christ's return in the Millennium. But, the Jews apply this to the *first* appearance of the Messiah.

Confirming the Covenant — What Jews are saying?

"It is evident that Jeremiah's use of the term 'a new covenant' does not involve the replacement of the (eternal) Torah by the New Testament. Rather, it signals a renewal of the original Sinai Covenant." — **Uri Yosef**, PhD ("Will the Real New Covenant Please Stand Up?")


"Jeremiah's 'new covenant' is not a replacement of the existing covenant, but merely a figure of speech expressing the reinvigoration and revitalization of the existing covenant." — **JewsforJudaism.org**

So that means that the Antichrist will *confirm the covenant* — actually *renew* the covenant of old, complete with the animal sacrifices and the rebuilding of the temple! This is confirmed once you continue the scripture.

And in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the offering to cease (Daniel 9:27 MKJV).

Therefore we can understand that, at the beginning of the seven years, he institutes the animal sacrifices (whether the temple is already built at this time or whether it begins to be built at that time remains to be seen). Then and Antichrist abruptly terminates the sacrifices in the middle of the week — that's three and a half years later.

THE ANTICHRIST IS NOT ISLAMIC!

Too many well-meaning Christians are being misled into combining endtime teachings of the Bible with the Koran. Scripture says, *To the Law and to the testimony! If they do not speak according to this Word, it is because no light is in them* (Isaiah 8:20 MKJV; compare 2 Corinthians 6:14).

Let's see just how problematic an Islamic Antichrist is to the realities of Middle Eastern sensibilities. We know that the Jews in the Middle East are awaiting their Messiah. Would the Jews embrace one who comes in the name of Islam, as in one who represents a religion that seeks the *destruction* of Israel?

Conversely, would the adherents of Islam support an Islamic leader over the Jews, who is *not* imposing Sharia Law on them, but is actively renewing God's covenant with Israel — thus subjugating and making inferior the religion of Islam to the Jews? How many Muslims would revolt against that?

More problems: Jesus makes it clear that many will be deceived in the end times. What would happen if the Antichrist *was Islamic*? The answer is plain — many Christians would quickly denounce him as Antichrist. But suppose he comes as a Jewish hero warrior, re-instituting the Old Covenant, rebuilding the temple and protecting Israel from terrorist neighbors? How many well-meaning supporters of Israel will fall for it?

Therefore, the Antichrist *must* be Jewish! Incidentally, the Jewish scholars who are still awaiting the Messiah will no doubt look to the scriptures for verification of the "Messiah's" appearance and they will give their allegiance to him.

They will be looking for one who will once again restore Jerusalem's greatness. Remember, this is the very thing that the disciples asked of Jesus in Acts 1:6 ("Will you now restore the Kingdom to Israel?").

Now let's review. The last prophesied week of Daniel is composed of seven years. At the beginning of the seven years — and this is how you will know when the seven years begins! — the one who will become the Antichrist renews the Old Covenant, reestablishing the temple and the animal sacrifices. Then three and a half years later, in the middle of the week, the animal sacrifices are abruptly terminated.

and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease, and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make it desolate, even until the consummation, and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate (Daniel 9:27 KJV).

In essence, it says that once the sacrifices to God are stopped, the Antichrist will himself demand worship as God (he is the abomination!) and will place himself within the temple, after which destruction will ensue. This is reflected in what Jesus says:

Therefore when you see the abomination of desolation, spoken of by Daniel the prophet, stand in the holy place (whoever reads, let him understand). Then let those in Judea flee into the mountains. Let him on the housetop not come down to take anything out of his house; nor let him in the field turn back to take his clothes. And woe to those who are with child, and to those who give suck in those days! But pray that your flight is not in the winter, nor on the sabbath day; for then shall be great tribulation, such as has not been since the beginning of the world to this time; no, nor ever shall be. And unless those days should be shortened, no flesh would be saved. But for the elect's sake, those days shall be shortened (Matthew 24:15-22 MKJV, also compare 2 Thessalonians 2:3-4).

Again, the **Great Tribulation** begins in the midweek point and technically lasts for three and a half years. We say *technically* because the Great Tribulation is so horrific that it is *cut short by His return!*

Notice, Jesus' last statement above: And unless those days (the Great Tribulation) should be shortened, no flesh would be saved (alive). But for the elect's sake, those days shall be shortened.

While we do not know by how much those three and a half years will be cut short, we do know that once it is cut, it begins the Day of the Lord and the return of Christ.

And, please, also notice that God's *elect* are *still* on the earth during the **Great Tribulation**! They have NOT been raptured, because the Rapture occurs before the **Day of the Lord**, which occurs *after* the Great Tribulation.



Part 3

EXPOSING THE ANTICHRIST



The following teaching will change the way we think about end-time prophecies

We are confused. We know biblical prophecy, we claim. But it seems we can't agree what scripture applies to *what, where* or *when!* We have some declaring with certainty that the horsemen of the Apocalypse are galloping full force, while others say the horsemen aren't even on the saddle yet!

Hence we have so many contrary opinions from the timing of the Rapture to whether saints are to be persecuted.

Where exactly are we in end-time events and the return of Christ? Is there a biblical timeline that we can measure prophecy's countdown and lay prophesied events in their chronological order so we can know what is to come?

Yes, there *is* such a timeline! It's biblical. And, it's in Daniel, Matthew and Revelation.

Then why haven't we been taught this? Because the timeline the church presently bases the prophetic countdown on is *flawed!* The church places unnecessary prophetic importance on the state of Israel.

We have been taught that Jesus was referring to the establishment of the state of Israel in 1948 when He said,

Now learn a parable of the fig tree; When his branch is yet tender, and putteth forth leaves, ye know that summer is nigh: So likewise ye, when ye shall see all these things, know that it is near, even at the doors (Matthew 24:32-33 KJV).

They say that the fig tree was always symbolic of Israel, and that once Israel became a state, the countdown had begun.

And we've believed that. Yet no one ever seems to go to Luke's account of the Olivet Prophecy to find that Jesus was not referring to the state of Israel at all. Luke says, *And he spake to them a parable; Behold the fig tree, and all the trees* (Luke 21:29 KJV).

Notice He was *not* singling out Israel. He was referencing *the fig tree and all trees!* He was simply emphasizing the speed in which *all these things shall come to pass* (vs 34); adding that *this generation shall not pass, till all these things be fulfilled* (Mat 24:34 KJV). And ever since 1948, we've had to extend the length of a biblical "generation" from 20 K to 40 K to 70 years (and we'll likely go beyond that, should the Lord tarry).

So, we've been misled on this and a number of important prophecies. Yet the Lord has given us precise instruction that will *define* the generation that will see all these things come to pass! It'll not be 70 years duration, it'll not be 40, it'll not be 20. It'll be swift and catch many unawares.

The scriptures speak of a seven year timeline: it's correct, it's unchangeable — and it's just that we either haven't been taught it or the revelation hasn't been understood until now (Daniel 12:9).

After reviewing the material found in this article, you will walk away with both a greater understanding of end time events (with a greater specificity that we've had before) and a deeper sense of God's intelligent design in the scriptures, as we marvel the unfolding of the unbending timeline from the old and new testaments.

Line upon line, here a little, there a little is the bible-prescribed method of studying scripture (Isaiah 28:9-10).

Let's now lay down our scriptures that support this timeline!

The book of Daniel is the most important book of the Old Testament, whose prophecies catapult the reader to its fulfillment in the days we're living in now.

God gave the 70 Week prophesy to Daniel as a timeline to denote the timing of the appearance and crucifixion of their Messiah, Jesus Christ, and, beyond, until the appearance and death of the end-time antichrist.

For review, here are some bullet points to consider about the 70 week prophecy (Daniel 9:25-27):

- God determined 70 weeks to fulfill His plan for the restoration of Jerusalem and His coming Kingdom;
- The 70 weeks, using the day for a year principle (Ezekiel 4:6), prophetically become 490 years;
- The first 69 weeks (or 483 years) precisely pinpoint the timeframe beginning with the pronouncement to rebuild the city of Jerusalem (445 BC) until the crucifixion of the Messiah (32 AD) (as converted to the Western calendar and adjusted for leap years);
- The last week of seven years duration has been held in suspension, by God's discretion, until an appointed time yet in our future, evidently in our lifetimes;
- That last week of seven years begins with the appearance of the antichrist and ends with the appearance of the Messiah.

SEVEN YEARS ON WHEELS

The beauty of this last seven years is that the Lord, in His infinite wisdom, can place this uninterrupted period of seven years anywhere He wishes on the world's calendar. God, and only God, can determine when is the best time to initiate this crucial, last seven years of the world's system, and the beginning of His Kingdom reign on earth.

Since God requires our participation in His work on the earth, this gives Him flexibility to delay things for the preparation of His people and the endtime harvesting of souls.

Hence, it's seven years *on wheels*, so to speak: It's calendar adjustable! It's not fixed to a prophetic starting date – it's fixed to an *event!* It's not something that will occur without notice – the world will see it on the news. And that event can occur at any time, but *only* at the discretion of the Lord (Matthew 24:36).

Therefore, what is important to note is that this seven year period – just ahead of us now! – will encompass the fulfillment of the major, end-time prophesied events from the Bible!

Using this key, we can begin to see how New Testament prophecies fit into this timeline of seven years, opening up to us a wealth of understanding!

RISE OF ANTICHRIST

If this seven years can happen at anytime, then how do we know when it begins? God's word tells us in the last line of Daniel's 70 Week Prophecy:

And he (the antichrist) shall confirm the covenant with many for one week: and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease, and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make it desolate, even until the consummation, and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate (Daniel 9:27 KJV).

Here it's telling us that someone, who will later become the antichrist, will *confirm the covenant*. Other translations say *will enforce a covenant* (Holman Christian Standard Bible) or *strengthen a covenant* (Young's Literal Translation).

Thus we see that one will come on the scene *confirming*, *enforcing*, or *strengthening a covenant* (apparently, an *already* "established" covenant! – since you can't *enforce* or *strengthen* a covenant that wasn't there before!).

Another clue is that the covenant must be pertaining to Jerusalem — since the entire 70 Week Prophecy has to do with Jerusalem! (Daniel 9:2).

Here we see the beginning of the last seven years! It begins when someone arises to enforce or strengthen a covenant in Jerusalem!

But what covenant?

SEVEN YEAR PEACE TREATY - NOT!

Many people believe that the antichrist confirms a *peace treaty* in the Middle East. But we know of no Bible translation that adds the word *peace* to this scripture.

Rather, the answer is contained within the scripture itself. Notice, the conformity of the two clauses in the phrase, inferring that the antichrist *confirms* a covenant, on the one hand, and then *breaks it*, by ending the sacrifices and oblations. In fact, as we know from other scriptures, what begins as a call to worship God, suddenly, when the 'man of sin' is revealed midpoint (2 Thessalonians 2:3), morphs into a demand to worship *antichrist* (Revelation 13:8).

Therefore, the covenant that the antichrist confirms, or enforces, can only be the reestablishment of the Mosaic/Levitical Covenant – complete with temple worship and animal sacrifices on Jerusalem's Temple Mount.

We have a tendency to believe that the antichrist is going to forcibly impose his authority upon Israel against its will. Perhaps it's a result of recent teachings that the antichrist will be Islamic. But no, Israel will welcome the false messiah, and he will be one of their own. Jesus said of the Jews, *I am come in my Father's name, and ye receive me not: if another shall come in his own name, him ye will receive* (John 5:43 KJV).

The Jews are, after all, still awaiting their Messiah, One who will establish the greatness of Israel's national identity and defeat their foes (Acts 1:6, Psalms 110:1-7). [We will see how that mindset fits in with biblical prophecy later in this teaching].

Furthermore, the antichrist will present a façade of "righteousness" in leading the nation of Israel to ritualistic animal sacrifices in a feigned atonement for sin. Then, suddenly, in the middle of the seven years, he abruptly morphs the worship towards God into worship towards himself.

Not understanding these points lead many to assume political leaders, who carry the attributes of antichrist, such as Barack Obama, could be *the* antichrist. But after Obama had abused Israel and its PM Benjamin Netanyahu, could you imagine that Israel would one day wake up and believe that Obama will confirm the covenant to begin temple worship in Jerusalem again? Not likely at all.

But getting back to the scripture, you'll also notice that the scripture says the covenant lasts but "one week" – that's the prophesied last seven years of this worldly age before the return of Christ. This doesn't mean that the covenant was drawn up as a seven-year covenant. God is merely telling us that it will only last seven years, as fulfillment of Daniel's Last Week.

SEALS WILL NOT BE BROKEN, UNTIL THE TIME

Now that we've established the foundation for this teaching, we can begin to show the correlation between Daniel's Last Seven Years and the endtime prophecies in the New Testament. We will show how the seals in the book of Revelation and Jesus' Olivet Prophecy correspond to the timeframe of *seven years*.

We've already established the precise action by the *antichrist* which will start the seven year countdown. Now let's review the chronology of the Seven Seals of Revelation (Revelation 6 to 10):

- The first four seals are the four horsemen of the Apocalypse: and can be broken down as false christs, war, famine and disease epidemics;
- The fifth seal is the Great Tribulation;
- The sixth seal is the signs in the sun, moon, stars;
- The seventh seal is the Day of the Lord (Christ's return), which is composed of Seven Trumpets, the seventh of which is composed of Seven Bowl Judgments.

After reading the next set of bullet points, please *reread* them again. It's very important to keep these points in mind as a foundation to fully understand what is to follow:

- · Each seal is closed until an appointed time;
- · Only Jesus was deemed worthy to open the seals;
- Jesus opens one seal at a time;

- That means the seals are released chronologically;
- That means the seals cannot be moved or switched about from their precise chronology to fit a preconceived prophetic theory;
- Notice that The Great Tribulation is not the same as the Day of the Lord. They are separated by the sixth seal, which is the signs in the sun, moon and stars. [Not understanding that there's a difference between the Great Tribulation and the Day of the Lord is the

major cause for so much confusion in the body of Christ, leading many into various interpretations for Christ's return. More about this later on in this teaching.]

THE FIRST SEAL – the Antichrist

John the aged Apostle was invited to see, in a heavenly vision, the sequential opening of the seven seals of an end-times, prophetic scroll. Jesus the Revelator peels open the first seal:

And I saw when the Lamb opened one of the seals, and I heard, as it were the noise of thunder, one of the four beasts saying, Come and see. And I saw, and behold a white horse: and he that sat on him had a bow; and a crown was given unto him: and he went forth conquering, and to conquer (Revelation 6:1-2 KJV).

We should notice, first off, that the rise of the final antichrist cannot occur *until* Jesus removes the seal! That means there is an appointed time, yet to come, for antichrist to arise – despite satan's best plans to accelerate the time and despite the many pseudo antichrists that have appeared over the millennia (1 John 2:18).

As soon as Jesus opens the seal, that's when events unfold on the earth fulfilling the prophetic seal. It is our contention that *this first seal will initiate Daniel's Last Seven Years.*

The antichrist is pictured here as the one riding the White Horse. He is the counterfeit Messiah, so he comes on a *White Horse* – which is why Jesus was so adamant about His followers not being deceived by false christs – since the counterfeit would be so convincing! (Matthew 24:4-5).

The counterfeit also comes complete with bow and crown, and begins conquering!

Both Strong's and Thayer's concordances indicate that the word *conquering* means to *carry off the victory,* or *come off victorious*. If he is the counterfeit Messiah, then he will be routing out *Israel's* enemies and be declared by acclamation a hero to both Israel and, later, the world.

But how does antichrist's conquering relate to Daniel's prophecy of a covenant? We read in Daniel that the antichrist will *confirm a covenant*. Yet, how would someone reaffirming the Levitical covenant of temple worship cause an outbreak of *conquering* others? And, secondly, isn't the antichrist going to come as a *man of peace*?

This is easy to answer if one has a grasp of current Middle East politics and news. Have you noticed that Jerusalem, and specifically the Temple Mount, is the most hotly contested parcel of land on the planet? What do you suppose would happen if Israel decided to begin animal sacrifices on the Temple Mount? If you understand the political climate of the Middle East, this act will enflame the entire Muslim world.

Many think that the antichrist will come as a *man of peace*, because they have mistakenly assumed that he initiates a "seven year peace treaty." But no, he is a man of war, as evidenced in Revelation 13:4, *And they worshipped the dragon (satan) which gave power unto the beast (antichrist): and they worshipped the beast, saying, Who is like unto the beast? who is able to make war with him?*

Any Jewish leader who lays claim on the Temple Mount will have to have raw nerves of steel, knowing what a Pandora's box of violence it will unleash on the region. Therefore, when Arab neighbors attempt to squash the covenant with attacks on Jerusalem but instead get routed up easily enough by Israel's military (as Israel has done in the past!), how quickly will this Jewish leader be heralded as a conquering hero? (Daniel 11:40-45).

Hence we will see the antichrist appearing on the world's scene conquering Israel's enemies. And MANY in the world will be deceived and support him for finally bringing retribution to the evil that Islamic terrorists have been committing throughout the world for decades.

THE OLIVET FIRST SEAL

In this study we are attempting to connect various biblical passages to show that the prophetic end-times is comprised of seven years – or

Daniel's Last Seven Years. We have seen that Jesus is the Revelator who opens the seals in the book of Revelation, therefore it is not surprising that Jesus also revealed the seals privately to His disciples while He was on the earth.

The Olivet Prophecy in Matthew 24, Mark 13 & Luke 21 parallel the Seals of Revelation. You'll recall that the disciples came to Jesus on the Mount of Olives privately to ask, *Tell us, when shall these things be? and what shall be the sign of thy coming, and of the end of the world?* (Matthew 24:3).

Jesus' entire remarks refer to the seven seals: The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse, the Great Tribulation, the signs of the sun, moon and stars and the Day of the Lord.

His first sign for them to look for is this:

Take heed that no man deceive you. For many shall come in my name, saying, I am Christ; and shall deceive many (Matthew 24:4-5 KJV).

Notice, this is a warning against the antichrist/false messiah! This is the same principle as the first seal in Revelation, yet you'll notice it's in the plural. Seeing that there would be many antichrists throughout the millennia until His return (1 John 2:18), Christ enlarged the scope of this seal to protect His flock from the many antichrists that could mislead and deceive His people through the ages. YET, the principle is the same — there will still be the final antichrist to come on the scene that will begin the seven year cycle ONCE the Lord breaks open the first seal of Revelation in the spirit, and once the antichrist affirms the covenant in the natural!

DANIEL'S TWO ACTIONS OF ANTICHRIST

Thus we have the correlation of the *first* action of antichrist in three portions of scripture:

- Daniel's 70 Weeks prophecy
- Revelation's first seal and
- · Jesus' first sign in the Olivet Prophecy

Now, let us show the correlation of the *second* action of antichrist from Daniel, and we'll see how all three portions of scripture again agree. Once

we've established this, we can more easily see that Jesus' Olivet prophecy and Revelation's seven seals are a period of seven years, which have nothing to do with the establishment of the state of Israel, and all to do with Daniel's seven years, beginning and ending with antichrist.

Thus, it is a duration of seven years that Jesus was referring when He said "this generation shall not pass till all these things be fulfilled" (Matthew 24:34).

We know that the seven years *begins* when antichrist confirms a covenant for one week – *seven years!* Then three and a half years later, the antichrist breaks the covenant and causes the temple sacrifices to cease. As we shall learn from related scriptures, the antichrist at this time sets himself up as god to be worshipped – *right at the midpoint of the seven years!*

And in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease, and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make it desolate, even until the consummation, and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate (Daniel 9:27 KJV).

The New Living Translation says it this way: And as a climax to all his terrible deeds, he will set up a sacrilegious object that causes desecration, until the fate decreed for this defiler is finally poured out on him.

Jesus confirms what Daniel says in the Olivet Prophecy, emphasizing the perilous times these will be:

When ye therefore shall see the abomination of desolation, spoken of by Daniel the prophet, stand in the holy place, (whoso readeth, let him understand:) Then let them which be in Judaea flee into the mountains: Let him which is on the housetop not come down to take any thing out of his house: Neither let him which is in the field return back to take his clothes. And woe unto them that are with child, and to them that give suck in those days! But pray ye that your flight be not in the winter, neither on the sabbath day: For then shall be great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time, no, nor ever shall be (Matthew 24:15-21 KJV)

Daniel affirms that after three and a half years antichrist will set up an object of worship in the temple. Jesus says that when that object – that "abomination of desolation" – is set up, this will be the **beginning of the Great Tribulation.**

The Apostle Paul tells us that the antichrist at this time will oppose and exalt himself above all that is called God, or that is worshipped; so that he as God sits in the temple of God, showing himself that he is God (2 Thessalonians 2:4).

At that time, many will be killed who refuse to worship the antichrist. Therefore Jesus tells His people to flee from the surrounding area, and for good reason – the fifth seal of Revelation also confirms this a time of martyrdom of God's saints:

And when he had opened the fifth seal, I saw under the altar the souls of them that were slain for the word of God, and for the testimony which they held (Rev 6:9 KJV) and These are they which came out of great tribulation, and have washed their robes, and made them white in the blood of the Lamb (Revelation 7:14).

If Jesus does not intervene to stop antichrist and cut those days short, Satan through antichrist would have killed everyone in the world.

For then shall be great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time, no, nor ever shall be. And except those days should be shortened, there should no flesh be saved: but for the elect's sake those days shall be shortened (Matthew 24:21-22 KJV).

Daniel 12:1 confirms that this is the worst time of trouble the world has ever known:

And at that time shall Michael (the archangel) stand up, the great prince which stands for the children of thy people: and there shall be a time of trouble, such as never was since there was a nation [even] to that same time: and at that time thy people shall be delivered, every one that shall be found written in the book (Daniel 12:1).

THE GREAT TRIBULATION LASTS 3 1/2 YEARS

While there are many who claim that the Tribulation lasts a period of seven years, technically and truthfully **The** *Great* **Tribulation** lasts *only* three and a half years.

Understanding this fact allows all the pieces of bible prophesy to fall into place, and once again we will see the exact correlation among the three areas of biblical prophecy we are examining.

• Antichrist's reign is 3 ½ years

Daniel already told us that antichrist's reign is three and a half years, from the time he enters the temple as god. Revelation confirms this: The beast (antichrist) was given a mouth speaking proud words and blasphemies, and he was permitted to exercise ruling authority for forty-two months (Rev 13:5 NET).

Persecution of the saints lasts 3 ½ years

Jesus tells His followers to flee from persecution (Matthew 24:16). Some will be persecuted, others will be protected: But the woman was given the two wings of a giant eagle so that she could fly out into the wilderness, to the place God prepared for her, where she is taken care of — away from the presence of the serpent — for a time, times, and half a time (Rev 12:14 NET). [A time is a year; thus a time (one year), two times (two more years) and a half a time (six months) is three and a half years. Scriptures show that some Christians are martyred, others are not. Each gives glory to God either way.]

• Protection of the saints lasts 3 ½ years


This is not inconsistent with the previous point. Some Christians will be persecuted and martyred. They will give glory to God by giving up their lives, while others will give glory to God by being protected during this time and remain alive at His return.

But the woman was given the two wings of a giant eagle so that she could fly out into the wilderness, to the place God prepared for her,

where she is taken care of — away from the presence of the serpent — for a time, times, and half a time (Rev 12:14, NET).

IT ALL ADDS UP TO DANIEL'S LAST SEVEN YEARS

Notice the chart below and we can see how the two actions of antichrist align themselves with key prophecies in the New Testament. There is a symmetry of events, which again speaks of the fulfillment of end-time prophecies in a *seven year time span*, from the arrival of antichrist to the arrival of the true Messiah!



Jesus speaks of the first three and a half years between the antichrist affirming and then breaking the covenant as the beginning of sorrows or birth pangs in Matthew 24:8. That includes the effects of war, famine, disease that the other three horsemen bring – all of which precede the three and a half years of the Great Tribulation.


The Great Tribulation is not the wrath of God, neither is it the return of Jesus. The wrath of God and His return is the Day of the Lord. Notice, both seals (five and seven) are separated by the sixth seal (signs in the sun, moon and stars). They are not the same. And it is this stubborn teaching that suggests that they are both the same that has brought about so much confusion in the body of Christ.

In essence, the Great Tribulation is satan's wrath against God's people and all mankind (Revelation 12:12). It becomes so severe that Jesus Himself says He has to cut short those days lest no one be saved alive. Read what He says:

For then shall be great tribulation, such as was not since the beginning of the world to this time, no, nor ever shall be. And except those days should be shortened, there should no flesh be saved: but for the elect's sake those days shall be shortened (Matthew 24:21-22 KJV).

Jesus says for the elect's sake those days will be shortened signifying that the elect of God are still on the earth, not having been raptured yet. That certainly throws a monkey wretch into the eschatology taught by many today!

You will also notice in the chart above that the Day of the Lord *does not* fall within Daniel's Last Seven Years, but *after* it. That is because the Day of the Lord is actually when Jesus returns, punishing and removing sinful humanity; bringing to an end the kingdoms of mankind; and establishing the Kingdom of God upon the earth.

WINDOW OF OPPORTUNITY

We've covered a lot of ground in this teaching. We have shown how Daniel's last seven years fits in with Jesus' own words both in Matthew and in Revelation. This timeline will help us understand the days to come in a more precise manner than before. That timeline begins when one comes who will confirm a covenant in Jerusalem. Upon that action, most of the rest of biblical prophecies fall.

This should help us avoid the constant refrain we hear so often: 'The countdown has already begun!" or the "Red Horse of war has already begun riding."

Actually, it can be said the countdown began since Christ's advent into heaven, but we need to understand something. While wars and poverty and false christs have been with us for millennia, the end-time seven years has not yet begun! It is therefore possible that we are several decades away from Christ's return.

Daniel's last seven years only begins when antichrist confirms a covenant in Israel. Then there will be an uninterrupted march of seven years of fulfilled prophecies that cannot be prayed away.

So, please don't get carried away, with every news event, purportedly fulfilling the end times. Of course, things are leading up to Christ's return. But the ultimate news event to watch is the antichrist affirming a covenant in Israel to reestablish temple worship.

Until that happens, we are free to pursue all that the Lord has destined for our lives! Don't let the fear of end-time events short circuit your drive, calling and destiny.

As we said before, Daniel's Last Seven Years is not fixed in scripture to a certain date, and can only begin when the first seal is opened! God is the only One who will determine when that begins. Until that time happens, we

can and should be praying on behalf of the nation. We should pray that America repents, that it turns back to God, that God have mercy on us all, that the waves of satanic legislation coming from Washington be rescinded, that Christians the world over be protected, and that life from the womb to old age is protected.


Now is not the time to give up hope and recede into apathy and ineffectiveness. Jesus commands His followers to *occupy till I come!* (Luke 19:13). Now, more than any other time before, is when we ought to be excelling in the fruits and gifts of the Holy Spirit and fulfill the very destiny that God has called us to achieve. God has allowed us to be living at a most pivotal time in all creation. Therefore God has a purpose for our lives, to do something challenging and rewarding – to literally *do* exploits! (Daniel 11:32). Now is the time to become ever more vigilant in defending truth and exposing evil. *Cry aloud, spare not, lift up thy voice like a trumpet and show My people their sins and the House of Jacob their transgression* (Isaiah 58:1).

We are to maintain our positions on the wall, even in battling ominous threats coming upon the earth; even in engaging the enemy who would seek to bring the nation to its knees before its time. Should a movement come afoot to keep a president in office through martial law, so long as that antichrist has not confirmed the covenant in Israel, I'm praying against it!

The whole point of this teaching is to show that Daniel's last seven years have not yet begun! Therefore, let us do all we can in God's power to defend truth and righteousness and carry out all that God has commissioned us.

Once Daniel's last seven years begins, then there is no way to pray for anymore delays. Everything prophesied will occur rapidly, though you could still pray for individual and family safety and salvation during the great tribulation. But until that happens, we must continue being the stewards of God upon the earth, proclaiming God's truth and revelations, and carrying out exploits with the power of the Holy Spirit to a hurt and dying world. The harvest now is bigger than ever before and that should be our paramount aim.
